### **OVERVIEW**









■ Oakland Mall is a 1.5 million square foot super regional shopping center located in the Detroit Metropolitan area of Michigan, serving approximately 650,000 people with an average income of about \$70,101.

■ Oakland Mall's family friendly atmosphere, selection of stores, with great access and visibility from major thoroughfares Interstate 75, 14 Mile Road, and John R Highway make it a top destination.

Oakland Mall's central location in the Tri-County shopping district continue to make it a powerful retail destination today and into the future.

Anchored by Macy's, Sears and JCPenney, Oakland Mall includes more than 128 specialty stores.

Oakland Mall has a variety of exciting stores including Aeropostale, Express/Express Men, Victoria's Secret, Forever 21, Bath & Body Works, and The Children's Place.

■ The Detroit Metropolitan area is home to six community colleges plus Oakland University and Wayne State University as well as campuses for the University of Michigan, Michigan State, Central Michigan, Western Michigan, and Eastern Michigan Universities. Within the market trade area enrollment for the universities is estimated at 100,000 students in the fall of 2011 and those universities have a total combined annual operating budget in excess of \$1.4 billion.

Oakland Mall as a total retail complex exceeds \$300 million in annual sales. In addition, the department stores are very strong in their respective districts: Sears is #1 out of 11, Macy's is #3 out of 18, and JCPenney is #3 out of 18.

Oakland Mall's trade area represents 66% of the shoppers and serves 30% of the total 3.86 million tri-county residents.






